BARRIE HOUSING

We are the largest non-profit housing provider in the City of Barrie, with 964 units in our 14-location portfolio across the city.

These units vary from townhomes, high-rise buildings, and multi-unit apartment complexes. With a team of just under 40 employees, we proudly serve our tenants from both in-building offices as well as two additional administrative locations: one at 339 Huronia Road and the other at 571 Bayfield Street.

Barrie Housing operates with a portfolio split of 60% Rent-Geared-to-Income units and 40% Market Rent units. We have a Tenant Services Department, dedicated to rental collection, unit viewings and Annual Income verifications. A Building Services Department, split into teams of technicians and building cleaners who are designated to communities within the portfolio. A Community Development Department, newly created in 2024, built around tenant needs, community connection, and financially building Barrie Housing through grants, fundraising and our Foundation. Additionally, we have both Administrative and Finance Departments; who maintain business operations and communications for the Organization.



BEYOND HOMES FOUNDATION

The Beyond Homes Foundation is the charitable arm of Barrie Housing, created to extend support beyond housing and into the mental and physical well-being of the communities we serve. While Barrie Housing provides safe and affordable homes, the Foundation focuses on enhancing quality of life by funding and supporting initiatives that address the social, economic, and personal barriers many residents face.

The Beyond Homes Foundation invests in projects such as food security, collaborations with community agencies, youth engagement, and tenant support initiatives. Its work is rooted in the belief that stable housing is only the beginning, and that thriving neighborhoods are built through connection, opportunity, and intentional care.

By bridging the gap between permanent housing and community support, the Beyond Homes Foundation plays a vital role in strengthening our 14 communities and empowering our tenants to succeed.

MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR

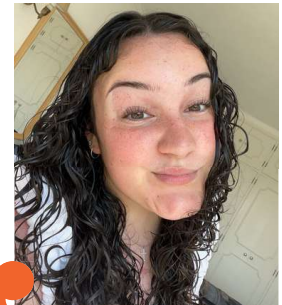
Known for his motivating attitude and ongoing support of the building service and cleaning staff, Perry has consistently helped foster a positive work environment across the organization since joining our team in 2021.

In 2025, our partnerships made a real difference in the everyday lives of tenants across Barrie Housing. By working closely with local agencies and service providers, we were able to connect people to the supports they need. Whether that was access to food, health services, or help navigating challenges. Just as importantly, these partnerships helped bring people together. AFTER THE BELL BUNDLES



Our After the Bell partnership with the Barrie Food Bank helped support children during the summer months when school nutrition programs are not available. Through this Food Banks Canada initiative, we supported the distribution of weekly food packs for 140 children over an 8-week period in July and August. Each pack included a mix of shelf-stable and refrigerated items, carefully selected to support healthy, reliable nutrition.

Barrie Housing assisted by helping connect the program to families within our communities and facilitating distribution through select buildings. Our support helped extend the reach of the program to children and families who were not already accessing food bank services. This partnership provided direct support to families while also strengthening Barrie Housing's community collaboration around child and family food security.

TURKEY DINNER HAMPERS

The Annual Turkey Raffle continued to be a meaningful holiday initiative for Barrie Housing, helping support families with festive food hampers and easing financial pressure during the Christmas season. The program once again saw strong participation with over 260 turkey hampers being applied for.

This year's hampers were made possible through key local donations, including grant support from CFS Counselling, buns from Fox's Bakery, cranberry sauce from Allstar Auctions, and fresh produce generously provided by Zehrs. These partnerships helped ensure high-quality, well-rounded hampers for families across our communities.

FROM WOMEN'S CONNECT

In September 2025, The Beyond Homes Foundation proudly took part in its first event as a registered charity.

This milestone reflected the growth of the organization and its expanding role within the local charitable landscape.



The "Women Connect" Event was designed to bring together women-led businesses and organizations to foster networking, collaboration, and stronger community ties. Evergreen Wellness Studio joined the evening as our featured speaker and partner, contributing to the event's success.

Raising \$1,050 in support of our Foundation, this event showcased what we are capable of in our community. The evening highlighted the value of partnership and networking efforts, as well as reinforced the importance of creating spaces where women can equally connect and grow together within the community.

WRAPPED GIFTS



The "Bags of Love" initiative in partnership with the Senior Wish Association, supported potentially isolated and vulnerable older adults within Barrie Housing this season. Over 60 individually wrapped gifts were provided to ageing tenants, with nominations coming through neighbors, grandchildren, caregivers, and community partners. Each gift was thoughtfully prepared to meet both practical and personal needs, helping to bring comfort and connection during the holiday season.

Through collaboration with our Community Development Department, the initiative strengthened ongoing efforts to support ageing tenants and reduce social isolation. Senior Wish Association and its partnership helped ensure that seniors who may otherwise be forgotten during the holidays were recognized and supported in a meaningful way.

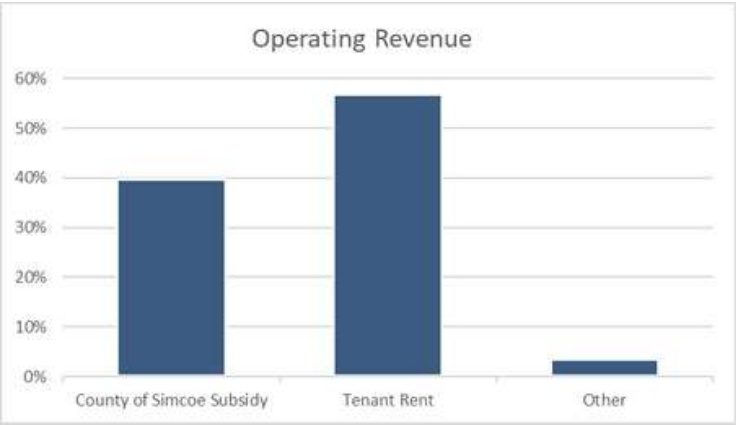
WHERE FINANCIAL STRENGTH MEETS HUMAN IMPACT

Behind every door is more than just housing — it is a place where families and communities build stability, connection, and opportunity. Maintaining those fundamental components of our portfolio requires thoughtful financial planning and responsible stewardship to ensure the 964 units we serve remain successful, safe and continue to thrive for the tenants within them.

Our financial investments support more than the maintenance and repairs of our housing portfolio; they help strengthen the everyday experiences of the people who call Barrie Housing home. From capital improvements and building operations to tenant supports and community-focused initiatives, every dollar plays a role in helping us create spaces where people can live well and build connected communities.

OPERATING INCOME



In 2025, the majority of our revenue —57%— came directly from tenant rental payments, reflecting the important role affordable housing costs play in the lives of those who call Barrie Housing home. Of this, 69.65% came from the low-end market rents, while 30.35% came from rent-geared-to-income households, highlighting the diverse but powerful housing needs we are proud to support.

Critical funding from our Service Manager, the County of Simcoe, continues to play an vital role in helping us provide affordable and well-maintained homes for more than 3,000 tenants across our communities.

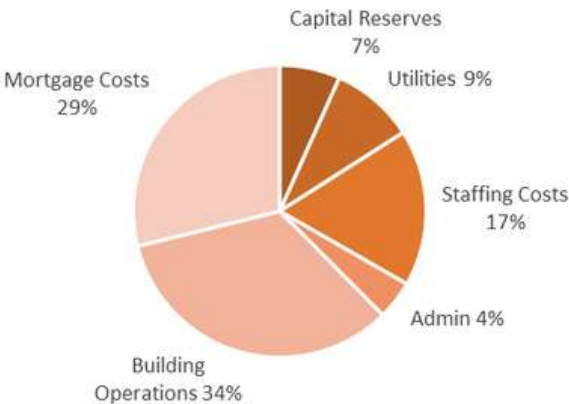
Additional revenue from parking, storage lockers and laundry services may seem small on their own, but together they help create opportunities, strengthen our neighbourhoods, and support the collaborative programs and services that make our communities more than just places to live.

OPERATING INCOME

A total of 72% of our total expenses were dedicated to building-related costs, including daily operations, repairs, maintenance, and mortgage obligations. These investments represent far more than bricks, mortar, and infrastructure, they represent our commitment to preserving the homes and communities we support at the 14 locations throughout Barrie.

Every repair completed, every system upgraded, and every building maintained helps create the stability our tenants deserve. Because when a home is secure, supported, and cared for, Life Happens Here.

THE INNER WORK OF 2025

Throughout the year, Barrie Housing continued to focus on the internal work required to maintain safe, reliable, and well-managed housing for our tenants. Across all departments, teams worked collaboratively to ensure that day-to-day operations supported long-term housing, with an emphasis on preventative maintenance, timely repairs, and proactive tenant support. These behind-the-scenes efforts play a critical role in preserving and improving service responsiveness, and ensuring that all 964 units remain stable and welcoming for tenants.

In addition operational work, staff across all departments worked closely to respond to evolving tenant needs. This included coordinated case management supports, referrals to community services, and ongoing attention to other social supports where needed. Together, these efforts reflect a year grounded in consistency and care, ensuring that every part of the organization contributed to keeping tenant well-being at the centre of decision-making.

39 DAYS

Legislated timeframe for renovations is 60 days within Simcoe County's social housing unit turnovers. Thirty-nine days was Barrie Housing's average amount of days needed to bring a unit from previously lived in to being ready to welcome a new family. This number shows the organizational excellence and focus our Building Services teams practice daily.

578

There were 578 Annual Reviews completed for rent-geared-to-income tenants in 2025. These reviews are necessary in order to maintain the rent subsidies these households are granted from the County of Simcoe. The reviews are calculated based on tenants' submission of documents to Tenant Services. The amount completed this year highlights the quiet but necessary work that Barrie Housing staff work through for our tenants.

This small, but mighty percentage highlights the Barrie Housing Vacancy Rate for 2025. The percentage showcases that of our 964 unit portfolio, we have under 1% of our units unoccupied. This has shown us that demand is high, giving Barrie Housing a renewed focus on ensuring we maintain proactive repairs, tenant supports and other needs as the need for safe, reliable housing is only increasing.

ROOF RENOVATIONS

The Maintenance Leadership team came together this year and successfully tendered and awarded contracts for new roof installations at two of our communities. Our Southfields complex comprised of both townhomes and four apartment buildings, as well as the Northfields' apartment building.

LIFE SAFETY

Barrie Housing Building Services teams collaborated with the City of Barrie, Barrie Fire and other specialized emergency safety support/businesses to complete Life Safety System assessments for the 27 apartment buildings and 202 townhomes we oversee; ensuring all 964 units and 14 locations had service completed.

PARKING LOT

In addition to new roofs this year, our Southfields complex was additionally approved for renewed paving on the property for tenant and visitor parking. Complete with newly painted and clearly numbered plots, identifiable accessible options, and clearly marked visitor and staff parking.

DRY SPRINKLER

Coulter was successful in the tendering process for a revitalized and updated dry sprinkler system in their underground tenant-only parking space.

These necessary installations and improvements help ensure our tenants' belongings and the homes they live in remain safe in case of emergency.

WHAT ALL OF THIS SHOWS US...

Organizational-wide commitment to both operational excellence and tenant-focused service remained at the forefront of 2025. This collective effort underlines the importance of the consistent, behind-the-scenes work that often goes unseen but is absolutely essential to the overall health of the organization's housing system.

As Barrie Housing closes this year, the efforts made and services provided this year will continue. Ultimately, this work reinforces our clear and steady commitment to sustaining quality housing and supporting the people who call it home.

LOOKING AHEAD INTO 2026

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LOOKING AT BARRIE HOUSING BEYOND HOMES FOUNDATION

As the Barrie Housing Beyond Homes Foundation enters 2026 as an established charity, our focus is shifting toward sustainability, growth, and strengthening the relationships that make our work possible. Building on the momentum of the final months in 2025, we are prioritizing the retention and engagement of donors, volunteers, and community supporters. Continuing to expand collaborative projects with local agencies, businesses, and partners. These partnerships will play an important role in supporting property revitalization efforts, tenant initiatives, and the continued growth of programs that enhance the lives of residents across Barrie Housing.

Internally, 2026 will also be a year of investment in our team. Through staff development, training, and ongoing learning initiatives, we aim to strengthen knowledge of the tenant demographic we serve, build confidence, and support professional growth across all departments.
